

Bird Walks at Burnaby Lake

Fed by Still Creek and drained by the Brunette River, Burnaby Lake is truly the heart of the city. Both the lake and the Central Valley are the products of glacial erosion during the Pleistocene epoch. Wildlife watchers will want to keep an eye out for great blue herons, northern flying squirrels, Pacific tree frogs, pied-billed grebes, red-winged blackbirds and western painted turtles. Join us for a guided walk of the trails surrounding Burnaby Lake with naturalist, George Clulow.

Walking trails are flat, natural terrain, so sturdy walking shoes are recommended. Depending on wildlife sightings and the group's desire to explore, distances will be between 1.5 and 3.5 kms.


Details

Wayfinding & Visit

Participants should meet in the Park & Tilford parking lot (northeast corner next to Moores) between 9:15 and 9:30 am to arrange carpooling.

Participants will then travel to the Nature House for a PROMPT 10 am start.



Parking is free at the Nature House, or at designated parking along Piper Ave, south of the railway tracks, immediately before the Nature House.

- **As this is a wildlife sanctuary, service dogs are strictly prohibited.**
