

Geological Rambles: North Shore

Our leader is Lindsay Bottomer, P. Geo. who has worked for over 40 years in mineral exploration, the last 27 years based in Vancouver. The course will consist of field trips to five locations within parks or nature areas that contain interesting and significant rock exposures. Participants will learn about aspects of the history and geological evolution of the region and how this governs many aspects of our daily life.
